Storm Update: March 08, 2018, 12:45 AM

Please continue to exercise extreme caution around any downed trees or electric wires, and be cognizant of *new* conditions that may have arisen due to the heavy snows and wind we have experienced over the past several hours. Residents should assume that any downed wire is live and presents an electrical hazard. Additional storm safety tips are available from www.coned.com. Please make sure friends and neighbors are signed-up for [Notify Me](#) and have updated their contact information in the Village's emergency robo-call system, [Blackboard Connect](#).

Today's Sanitation pick-ups will be completed as normally scheduled, but some may be later than usual due to our continuing storm response activities. Residents are requested to either clear a path for the pick-up or place garbage at the curb.

Heavy snows and wind have caused additional downed trees and other conditions that have resulted in new road closures, as follows:

1. Tunstall Road (Madison Road – Nelson Road)
2. Brewster Road (Huntington Ave – Kingston Road)
3. Claremont Road (Berkeley Road – Walworth Ave)
4. Post Rd (Burgess Road – Olmsted Road)
5. 77 Popham Road – West bound lane closed
6. 9 Carman Road closed at Gaylor
7. Eton and Greendale
8. Cambridge and Rugby (Mamaroneck – Rugby)
9. 55 Penn – Branch on house service across the road

The global restoration target for all power outages in Westchester County is now Friday at 11:00 PM, though the Village continues to pressure ConEd for additional local restoration crews. All

outage reports and related requests should be directed to ConEd either [online](#) or by phone using 1-800-752- 6633. Restoration status can also be checked online through [ConEd's Outage Map](#).

If you or a neighbor are using a portable generator, please review the following safety tips provided by the Scarsdale Fire Department:

- **Never** run a generator inside of a building. This includes the garage or basement. Within minutes Carbon Monoxide can build up - this colorless, odorless, gas kills occupants with no warning every year.
- **Always** place generators at least 10 feet from any structure. The exhaust must face away from any openings. Fans will not prevent Carbon Monoxide buildup.
- **Never** place generators on or near combustibles. This includes decks, porches and tool sheds. The heat generated by the motor or improper refueling can start a fire.
- **Never** modify, construct, or connect a generator to a dryer, range, or other household receptacle.
- **Always** follow your manufacturer's generator instructions to avoid electrocution.
- **Never** store fuel for your generator in your house. Flammable liquids should always be stored outside living areas in properly labeled, and ventilated containers.
- **Always** make sure you have working carbon monoxide and fire detectors installed.
