Subject: **Residence A Districts Lot Coverage
Study – Report and Additional Recommendations**

We are pleased to submit a report and additional recommendations regarding the analyses of the regulation of lot area coverage and gravel paving in the Residence A Districts of the Village of Scarsdale Code.

Methodology

As presented in greater detail in our March 13, 2015 Preliminary Report, an analysis of Scarsdale and other municipal regulatory and operational approaches to lot area coverage, development and impervious surfaces was completed.

A review and comparison of how Scarsdale and similar communities in Westchester and Nassau Counties regulate lot coverage and impervious surfaces was undertaken and documented. We met with Elizabeth Marrinan, AICP, the Village staff planner, Frank Balbi, P.E., the Village engineer, and the Planning Board to understand how the pertinent regulations of the Scarsdale Code are applied and used to review land use applications.

To understand lot area coverage in Scarsdale, the extent of gravel driveways in the Village, and the potential reasons for residents' desires for non-conforming lot coverage, a *Driveway Inventory Analysis* was prepared by the Village of Scarsdale Engineering Department, and a survey of recent stormwater management and erosion control (SWEC) applications approved in 2013 and 2014 was conducted. From the two surveys referenced, a sample of Village properties was developed for further analysis.

The results of the sample-properties analyses were submitted to the Planning Board in our March 13, 2015 memorandum.
